Spring Clean-up Set for Wednesday, May 21st!



It's Spring Clean-Up time! The City of West Burlington offers residents an opportunity to dispose of items that can not be disposed of with normal garbage collection. Please read the list of permitted items and follow the guidelines below.

SPRING CLEAN-UP GUIDELINES:

Please follow these simple rules when setting items out for Spring Clean-Up:

1. Residents need to place their permitted items at the front curb before 7:00 am on Wed., May 21st. Items placed at the curb after 7:00 am will not be collected.
2. Do not place unauthorized items at the curb. Crews will not sort through piles to find permitted items.
3. Place items at the curb no sooner than one week before the collection date. Items that are not picked up must be removed within one week following the collection date to avoid a nuisance violation.
4. Separate major appliances from other items.

Spring clean-up is not available to businesses, apartment complexes or residents living outside the city limits.

The City WILL pick up:

- Appliances
- Furniture
- Carpet
- Mattresses



The City will NOT pick up:

- Tires & Batteries
- Televisions and Computer Monitors
- Hazardous Liquids
- Yard Waste
- Demolition Materials (drywall, wood, glass and paneling)
- Normal Household Garbage (If it can go in your regular garbage it will not be collected during clean-up)

SUMMER SCHEDULE BEGINS MAY 1ST

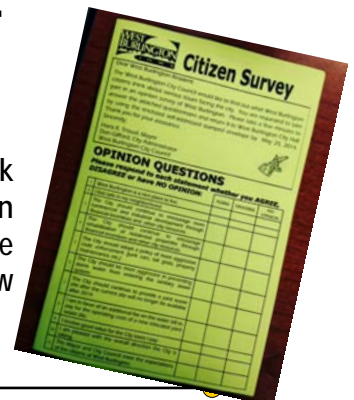
West of Leffler – Monday & Thursday

WEATHER POLICY



You can never plan for bad weather. Our policy this year will be if the pool can not open due to inclement weather check back at 2:00 pm. At that time, a decision will be made whether to reopen or stay closed the remainder of the day.

SWIM LESSONS

Registration will take place at the swimming pool beginning May 31st during regular pool hours.

Children will be grouped according to ability and must be at least 5 years old to participate. Due to inclement weather, eight lessons will be considered a full session. Private lessons are not available.

GAZEBO RENTAL

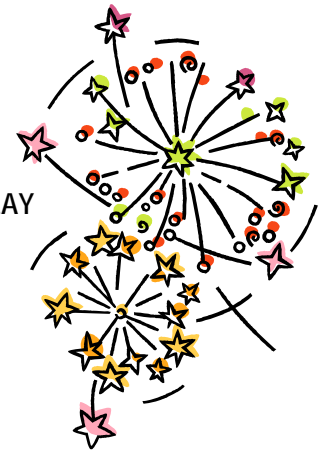

We are very pleased to provide you with the 2013 Annual Water Quality Report. This report keeps you informed about the excellent water and services we have delivered to you over the past year and contains important information regarding the water quality in our water system. Our goal is, and always has been, to provide you with a safe and dependable supply of drinking water. West Burlington purchases water from the Burlington Municipal Waterworks. DEFINITIONS

*Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) – The highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.

*Maximum Contaminant Level Goal (MCLG) - The level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.

*ppb - parts per billion.

*ppm - parts per million.

*N/A – Not applicable

*RAA – Running Annual Average

*NTU – Nephelometric Turbidity Units. Provides for on-the-spot measurement of turbidity in water.

*SGL– Single Sample Result

*Action Level (AL) – The concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.

*Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level Goal (MRDLG) - The level of a drinking water disinfectant below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MRDLGs do not reflect the benefits of the use of disinfectants to control microbial contaminants.

*Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level (MRDL) - The highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water. There is convincing evidence that addition of a disinfectant is necessary for control of microbial contaminants.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water



posed a health risk. More information about contaminants or potential health effects can be obtained by calling the Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

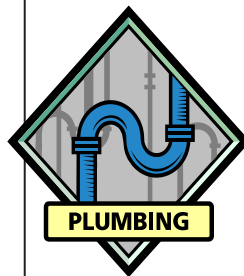
Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. EPA/CDC guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by *Cryptosporidium* and other microbial contaminants are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

If present, elevated levels of lead can

cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing.

West Burlington Municipal Water is responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can

minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water



for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. Information on lead in drinking water, testing methods and steps you can take to

CONTAMINANT VIOLATIONS

West Burlington Municipal Water had no contaminant violations in 2013.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE



GRASS & WEEDS

This time of year the City starts to receive complaints of tall grass and weeds. The City Code requires property owners or tenants to maintain grass, weeds and brush on their property. Grass in all areas of town should not exceed a height of six

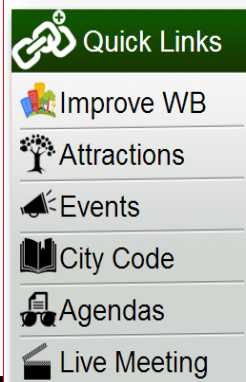
(6) inches and when mowing your yard clippings cannot be blowing into the street. Any undeveloped property must be maintained within 100 feet of any adjoining street, alley or developed property.

NUISANCE ISSUES

The building inspector makes routine inspections throughout town looking for nuisances. Take a look around your property to make sure you aren't in violation. The following is a list of items that can not be stored outside and would be considered a violation of City Code:

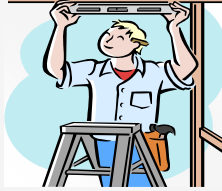
- Old scrap copper, brass, lead, iron, steel or metal
- Old or discarded rope, rags, batteries, paper trash, rubbish, debris, waste or used lumber (*Neatly* stacked firewood on a side yard or rear yard is not considered junk.)
- Dismantled vehicles, machinery and appliances or parts of these items
- Discarded glass, tin ware, plastic or household goods or hardware.
- Inoperable or unlicensed vehicles.
- Vehicles, Campers, Boats blocking sidewalks or parked on a surface that is not durable and dust free.
