NUISANCE ABATEMENT & BUILDING PERMITS

Warm weather is upon us and several community events are planned over the next few months. Take a moment to look at your property and see if things need spruced before summer. You might be surprised by the impact the winter months have had.

Take a couple hours to pick up any loose items, get your landscaping back in shape and put misc. items away.

As a reminder, the following items can NOT be stored outside and would be considered a violation of City Code:

- Old scrap copper, brass, lead, iron, steel or metal
- Old or discarded rope, rags, batteries, paper trash, rubbish, debris, waste or used lumber (Neatly stacked firewood on a side yard or rear yard is not considered junk.)
- Dismantled vehicles, machinery and appliances or parts of these items
- Discarded glass, tin ware, plastic or household goods or hardware.
- Inoperable vehicle or defective vehicles

If you are making any structural changes or improvements it is important to check with City Hall to see if a Building Permit is required.

Permits are required for the following:

- New Construction
- Additions/Remodeling affecting a load bearing wall
- Signage
- Sidewalks (ask about the City's cost sharing program)
- Driveways
- Siding
- Fencing
- Roof (beyond shingles)
- Deck/Patios
- Swimming Pool (if permanent structure)

DEFINITIONS

- *Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) – The highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.
- *Maximum Contaminant Level Goal (MCLG) - The level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.
- *ppb - parts per billion.
- *ppm - parts per million.
- *N/A – Not applicable

*RAA – Running Annual Average

*NTU – Nephelometric Turbidity Units. Provides for on-the-spot measurement of turbidity in water.

*SGL– Single Sample Result

*Action Level (AL) – The concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.

*Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level Goal (MRDLG) - The level of a drinking water disinfectant below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MRDLGs do not reflect the benefits of the use of disinfectants to control microbial contaminants.

*Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level (MRDL) - The highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water. There is convincing evidence that addition of a disinfectant is necessary for control of microbial contaminants.

*LRRA– Locational Running Annual Average

*ND– Not Detected

GENERAL INFORMATION

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water posed a health risk. Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. EPA/CDC guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by *Cryptosporidium* and other microbial contaminants are available from the Safe



Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. West Burlington Municipal Water is responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. YARD WASTE REMINDER

When mowing your lawn this summer, you should point the mower so grass clippings are not blowing into the street. When grass clippings end up in the street, they end up in the storm sewer drains and which can cause drainage problems during heavy rains. The



City does its part by sweeping the streets regularly with the street sweeper, but it is not designed to handle landscape waste.

DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITING

We have had an increase in complaints about solicitors going door-to-door selling items such as cleaning supplies, books, magazines and offering free carpet cleaning. ALL solicitors are required to obtain a permit from the West Burlington Police Department.

If a solicitor comes to your door, please ask to see their Solicitors Permit. Every person going door-to-door is issued their own permit and instructed to carry it with them for residents to view.

If someone comes to your door without a permit, turn them away and contact the Police Department at 754-8555 or 753-8371 to report this activity.

Open Burning Permitted on Specified Dates Only

Open burning of leaves in trash burners/burning barrels or on concrete pad shall be permitted on specific days during daylight hours. A permit is required for a burning barrel.



Permitted dates are:

- **April 1st - April 21st** on Wednesdays and Saturdays
- **October 15 - November 30** on Wednesdays and Saturdays

NO household garbage, garden waste or grass can be burned in a burning barrel. Outdoor cooking fires are permitted as long as they are in manufactured fire pits designed for that purpose.

ANIMALS PROHIBITED FROM RUNNING AT LARGE



The City of West Burlington does have a leash law and prohibits people from allowing their pets to run at large in the city limits. If you don't have a fenced in area to keep your pet on your property they must be on a leash and under the complete control of the owner. Animals found at large will be seized and impounded.
