### SPRING CLEAN-UP GUIDELINES

- Do not place unauthorized items at the curb. Crews will not sort through piles to find permitted items.
- Items need to be at the front curb by 7:00 a.m. on May 2nd
- This clean-up is NOT available to businesses, apartment complexes or anyone outside the city limits.

Mattresses

#### NOT PERMITTED

- Tires, Televisions and Computer Monitors
- Hazardous Materials or Liquids, Batteries, Yard Waste
- Demolition Materials (drywall, wood, glass and paneling)
- Household Garbage that could be collected with your regular weekly garbage collection



## WATER QUALITY REPORT FOR 2017

We are very pleased to provide you with the 2017 Annual Water Quality Report. This report keeps you informed about the excellent water and services we have delivered to you over the past year and contains important information regarding the water quality in our water system. Our goal is, and always has been, to provide you with a safe and dependable supply of drinking water. West Burlington purchases water from the Burlington Municipal Waterworks. In 2017 our water quality testing showed the following results:

### DEFINITIONS

\*Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) – The highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.

\*Maximum Contaminant Level Goal (MCLG) - The level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.

\*ppb - parts per billion.

\*ppm - parts per million.

\*N/A – Not applicable

\*RAA – Running Annual Average

\*NTU – Nephelometric Turbidity Units. Provides for on-the-spot measurement of turbidity in water.

\*SGL– Single Sample Result

\*Action Level (AL) – The concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.

\*Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level Goal (MRDLG) - The level of a

drinking water disinfectant below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MRDLGs do not reflect the benefits of the use of disinfectants to control microbial contaminants.

\*Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level (MRDL) - The highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water. There is convincing evidence that addition of a disinfectant is necessary for control of microbial contaminants.

\*LRRA– Locational Running Annual Average

\*ND– Not Detected

### GENERAL INFORMATION

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water posed a health risk. Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. EPA/CDC guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by *Cryptosporidium* and other microbial contaminants are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. West Burlington

Municipal Water is responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components.

When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. 


## **NEW GARBAGE CARTS FOR WB RESIDENTS**

LaVeine Sanitation will be delivering new garbage containers to West Burlington residents beginning this month. The new containers will allow them to move into an automated system for collection.

### **WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:**

- There is no cost to residents for the new container.
- All collection items need to be placed in the cart.
- The new 95 Gallon carts will hold 7-8 tall kitchen bags.
- The container is for waste generated at the assigned address only.
- Each residential address will be assigned a container. The container is the property of LaVeine Sanitation and should not be removed from the address.
- Place your container within 3 ft. of the street or alley and away from other objects.
- If you wish to dispose of your current garbage can, clearly mark it with the word "Pitch" or "Trash". You may also place it inside your new collection cart.



### **COLLECTION SCHEDULE:**

Twice a week garbage collection runs **May 1 — Oct 31**

- West of Leffler St. - Monday & Thursday
- East of Leffler St. - Tuesday & Friday

\*\*Routes **may** be restructured after the automated collection system is in place.

## **SOURCE WATER ASSESSMENT INFORMATION**

The West Burlington water supply obtains all of its water from another public water supply. It is a consecutive water supply, where an originating parent supply provides drinking water to one or more downstream supplies.
