'Tis the Winter Season



Snow and ice on sidewalks can be slippery and dangerous, not only to mail carriers and other delivery people but also to senior citizens, children, and the public in general. With winter approaching, we would like to remind residents and property owners that it is your responsibility to keep sidewalks adjacent to your property free and clear of snow and ice. City Code states that sidewalks must be cleared within 48 hours after the end of a snowfall. Properties that do not remove the snow or ice accumulations from their sidewalk may be subject to a fine of \$150 per removal, and the city may choose to perform the work and assess the costs against the property.

In best efforts for plows to remove accumulation effectively and efficiently after a winter storm, please try to keep parked vehicles off streets. This practice allows the snowplows to clear the streets quicker and with fewer passes. With everyone's cooperation declaring a snow emergency is unnecessary, as it can be costly and inconvenient for everyone.

Ultimately, the city cannot prevent snow from being pushed into your driveway apron by plows. Please be mindful of City Code when clearing paths. It is unlawful to throw, push, or place any ice or snow from private property, sidewalks, or driveways onto the street or alley. Residents may find it less frustrating to wait until plows have completed their street before clearing the end of their driveways.

The Public Works Department appreciates your cooperation and patience during snow removal.

Water Tips for Cold Temperatures

PREVENT HOME WATER LINE FREEZE-UPS



Each year, homes in West Burlington may experience frozen water lines. Not only are they inconvenient, but they can cause extensive water damage when pipes burst.

Tips to help you prepare your home for an Iowa winter:

- If the water meter is in a crawl space, closet, or enclosed area of your home, be certain that heat and ventilation are adequate to prevent freeze-ups.
- Cracks and holes in outside walls should be sealed with caulk or spray-in foam to prevent cold air from reaching nearby pipes.
- Furnaces should be checked regularly, and doing so can prevent frozen pipes and is a safety measure. If your home is unoccupied, have a friend or neighbor check regularly, especially if the furnace is turned off or at a very low setting.
- Shut off water valves to outside faucets.
- All water leaks should be repaired immediately. Even a small leak can cause extensive water damage to your home and furnishings. In addition, the cost of leaking water is reflected on your bill.
- If a water pipe bursts, turn off the water at the main inside shut-off valve, typically located near the water meter.
- Do not try to thaw a pipe with an open flame. This can damage more than just the pipe; it may also start a fire.

Alternative Utility Payment Options:

- ON-LINE payments - www.westburlington.org
- DROPBOXES - located at the front entrance and in the parking lot behind City Hall. The secure payment boxes are monitored by a surveillance camera & checked daily.
- DIRECT PAYMENT PLAN (AKA ACH payments) - Payments will be taken directly from a bank account around the 12th of every month. We ask that you complete a sign-up form before your first payment.

Winter Driving

From Chief Logan



Another winter driving season is just around the corner. West Burlington Police would like to remind you of some simple tips to help keep you and your loved ones safe. Make sure your vehicle is in good working order. Listed are items that, if not maintained properly, can cause issues or breakdowns on winter roads.

Take the time to:

- Check Tire pressure
- Change worn out wiper blades
- Check the battery condition
- Check fluid levels
- Clean off the windshield before driving
- Check the serpentine belt
- Keep your fuel tank at $\frac{1}{2}$ tank or above

Watch for approaching winter storms. When we experience a severe winter storm, travel only if necessary. Check 511ia.org for road conditions and weather closure before heading out.

Slow down and pay attention! Wet, icy, and/or snow-packed roads can easily double the amount of space required to adequately stop your vehicle once you apply the brakes. Pay close attention to changing road conditions and traffic while you are driving.

Stay in your vehicle. If you are involved in an accident, and it is feasible, move to a safe location and call 911. Staying inside your vehicle is a much safer place to be rather than standing on the side of the road where other vehicles might hit you.

Carry a simple winter kit. A kit can be made from items you have in your home already. Place a tote containing a shovel, blanket, first aid kit, phone charger, and a small bag of kitty litter to help assist in case of an emergency.

Boards & Commissions



The City of West Burlington has several opportunities for you to get involved. There are several Boards and Commissions to help make decisions and guide what the future of our community should look like. We are often looking for volunteers to fill these positions. Volunteering allows you to connect to your community and make it a better place to live, work, and play. Helping out with the smallest tasks can make a real difference to the lives of people, animals, and organizations in need. Volunteers are often the glue that holds a community together. The most significant benefit of getting involved and volunteering is the impact a group of dedicated volunteers has on the community.

- **Planning and Zoning Commission**—The Commission reviews and makes recommendations to the City Council on rezoning applications, subdivision plat approval, and amendments to the Zoning and Subdivision Ordinance. Commission members are responsible for reviewing zoning and subdivision applications regarding their impact on the neighborhood, community, environment, and the city's utilities and transportation systems. The Commission will be updating the city's 20-Year Comprehensive Plan over the next couple of years. The Planning and Zoning Commission meets quarterly or as needed.
- **Board of Adjustment**—The Board hears matters that could arise in conflicts on properties within the city, such as setbacks on lots or sizes of additions to current structures. The Board of Adjustment meets as needed.
- **Animal Hearing Board**—The Board consists of volunteer members, with at least one member representing the Humane Society and one representing the veterinarian profession. The Board conducts hearings and issues orders to abate animal nuisances and protect the community from dangerous animals. The Board also makes recommendations to the City Council and West Burlington Police Department concerning animal issues, including animal-related legislation, animal control regulations, and the Humane Society Animal Facility operation. The Board is not part of the Animal Control Enforcement Unit within the city but is an independent body created by this chapter. The Animal Hearing Board meets as needed.
- **Fire Department**—has openings for volunteers who are interested in joining. Applications can be picked up at WB City Hall.
- **Police Department**—has openings for reserve officers. Contact Chief Jesse Logan for more information.
